QCS COVID Frequently Asked Questions

What can I do to help?

The health and safety of QCS begins each morning at home. Please follow the daily symptom checklist prior to sending your child to school. Encourage good hand-washing and hygiene. Encourage your child to listen to instructions and to follow the distancing and mask-wearing procedures that are put in place. Let the school know of any changes or symptoms that your child may be experiencing.

Will my child need to wear a mask?

When your child enters the building, walks the hallways, or leaves they will need to be wearing a mask. When they are in class we have worked hard to allow for 6 feet distance between students which would allow for the removal of the mask. If small-group learning takes place and students and teachers are not able to maintain 6 feet distance than masks will need to be worn.

How will you ensure that students are social distancing within the hallways?

We will work to have faculty/staff monitoring and reminding students of their responsibility in keeping each other safe. If possible, we will have MS/HS student lockers spread further apart to promote distancing.

Will my child go to the cafeteria for lunch?

At this time students will be eating in their classrooms. Cafeteria/kitchen staff will be delivering meals for those that are purchasing school lunch.

Will my elementary school child have recess?

Yes. At this time we are expecting our students to have appropriate outdoor recess. While it is unfortunate, If students are not able to social distance they will need to wear masks.

What will arrival and departure look like?

We are asking families and students to do a staggered entry and exit of the building. Upon arrival, students will be given hand sanitizer and be asked to move directly to their classroom. If we need to slow entry to allow proper distancing we will do that. For dismissal, we will be deliberate about calling students to their busses or family vehicles to ensure a safe departure.

Are visitors allowed on campus?

We are working hard to limit the number of visitors on campus. We recognize that this is against the norm of the culture of the school but also want to make sure that our students and staff are as safe as possible. If you would like to visit we would expect you to use the prescreen checklist prior to coming on campus. Additionally, you may be screened upon entry. If the reason for your visit is unwarranted you may be denied entrance.

Is there any ability to do distance learning instead of in person?

At this time we are not pursuing this direction. It is the belief of QCS to provide a solid, safe, and caring education with attention to the student. When hybrid/synchronous teaching takes place it is our belief that all students are impacted in the level of learning. In the event that we are forced to close portions or the entire building, we will move directly to online learning for all students.

Will my child receive bussing from our home district?

If you utilize your public district transportation you should be in contact with your district's office. The districts will provide you with guidance and guidelines regarding their services.

What will happen to events as listed on the calendar?

At this time we are moving forward with the school calendar as published. It is far easier to remove an event than to add one. With that being said, we are moving forward with our first day being Monday, August 31st.

What steps do I need to take in the event my child is not able to come to school due to symptoms?

Please contact the school immediately! Send an email to the office staff AND the homeroom teacher. Additionally, please call and leave a message on the general mailbox. Once this is done please follow the guidelines as listed in our "Return to School Guidelines."

If my child develops symptoms during the school day, what happens?

We have a dedicated room and area that will be used as a containment room. If a student becomes ill we move them to this room and immediately call persons on the family emergency phone list for immediate pickup. If a staff member becomes sick we will have them leave the building quickly. We would then have families follow the guidelines that are in place.

What if someone tests positive or is presumptive positive?

QCS would contact the Bucks County Department of Health and take action from their recommendation regarding communication with those that may have come in contact with that person.
