A – Accountability: to themselves, to teammates, to friends and family. We reminded them it is easy to blame someone else for a mistake (or turnover). It is hard to take accountability to say to yourself "what could I have done to help avoid it?" As the players began to understand and accept accountability, we as coaches could see a change in how they managed their emotions. They now controlled the situation instead of letting it control them.

R – Respect: respect for themselves, their teammates, the opposing team, the referees, and most importantly respect for their family and loved ones who supported them on and off the court. Respect was a core component of this team.

S – Sacrifice: sacrifice the open shot for a teammate in a better position to shoot. Sacrifice their time and care for others less fortunate. Appreciate the sacrifice of family and supporters who got them to practice, picked them up from practice, came out to the games and cheered.

High School Girls' Basketball

From Coach Kevin Tomlinson:

"Keep shooting, girls. Keep shooting." Over and over again, we reminded the girls to take the open shot. With that comes an understanding that even the best players might make roughly half their shots. That means that in basketball, as in life, there will always be ups and downs, where a few shots here or there can drastically affect results. What we're incredibly proud of, though, is that our girls get up and keep taking those shots. Those reminders, along with the efforts put in each day by everyone connected with the QCS Girls' basketball, proved that our team 'Trusts the Process" in moving the entire program forward.

Growth and success are rarely linear. With our movement forward, there are ups and downs, just as there are in life's many endeavors. That lesson became evident to our girls when our season ended abruptly and short of our hopes. That final playoff game doesn't define our season or our progress forward, but rather serves as a reminder for the work that still lies ahead.

As we move into the offseason, we look at many notable improvements. The Bears went from last place to 3rd place. Two wins to nine wins (and three losses by three points or less!). We recognize three starters receiving All-Conference recognition, and others that deserved consideration. Our girls finished 2nd and 3rd in our first ever tournaments, and hosted the first home playoff game in program history. We were thrilled the girls got to experience that atmosphere in front of their friends and family.

Comparing the numbers from last year to this year affirms that growth throughout the program. Across

three league games in our first year, the Bears scored a combined 23 points in losses to Salem, Upper Bucks, and Valley Forge. This year, we scored 111 points in three of our games against those same opponents, coming up with two wins and a nailbiting one point loss to the eventual champion, Upper Bucks. Against Valley Forge, we lost last year 43-6 in what Mrs. T dubbed "The Lunch Table" game, as we were recruiting players to join the team during lunch. This year, a 41-32 win against the same opponent, with stellar defense against the league MVP, highlighted a key part of our season. All of those evenings spent conditioning, the opengym practices over the holidays, and the extra efforts put forth by our girls contributed to that growth and success.

The year began with an emphatic 70-47 win against Salem Christian for homecoming.

The Bears welcomed skilled newcomers like Mike Parrish and Matt Weikel. They picked up their first-ever in-season tournament win against Upper Bucks at the Rich Leister Memorial Tournament. For the 2nd year in a row, they defeated the defending league champion (Calvary Baptist) in the regular season.

A tremendous individual and team accomplishment was reached this year. Against West Chester Christian on 2/6, Senior Center Drew Moyer became QCS' first-ever 1,000 point scorer. It was a tremendously exciting experience as spectators counted down in stands. Drew needed 11 points going into that game to make it – we didn't know if he was going to hit it in the first quarter or the 4th – but he stormed out of the gates with 10 1st quarter points and hit 1,000 early in the 2nd quarter. As he did on so many of QCS' baskets over the years, point guard Marcus Ridley provided the assist.
